Dear OLG School Community...


Wow, what a fantastic year it's been!



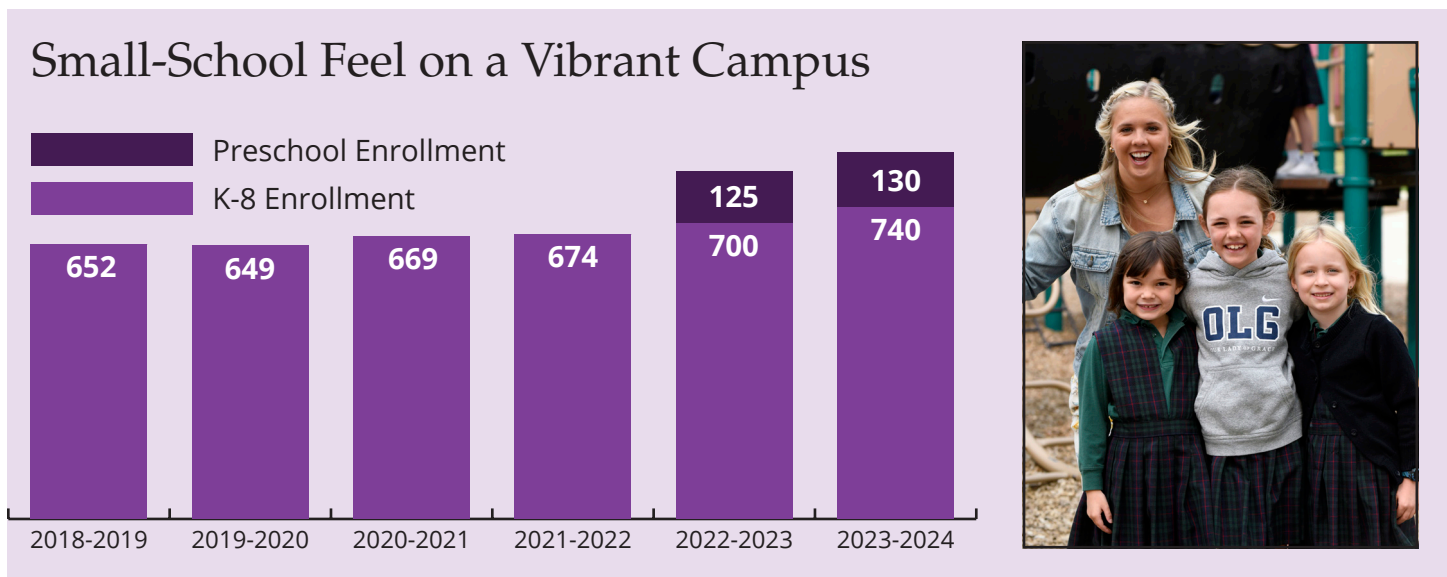


Preparing for the Future

Our First Year of Preschool is in the Books!

The inaugural year of our Preschool was a huge success! We are so thankful to parents for taking a leap of faith and enrolling their children in our brand new program and for trusting us throughout the process. We have been blessed to be able to offer two different preschool programs: the Little Saints Program for ages 3 - 4, and the Young Scholars Program for ages 4 - 5.

We are so thankful for the leadership of our Preschool Director, Ms. Nicole Rogers, our amazing Preschool Teachers, and our dedicated parents. With God's guidance, the Preschool at OLG is off to a tremendous start! Just as preschool education gives students a solid foundation for the future, our Preschool has a solid foundation to build upon as we move forward together.



As the enrollment of Our Lady of Grace Catholic School increases, OLG Parish and School leaders celebrate the opportunity for evangelization and make deliberate decisions to protect the small-school feeling that permeates our community and allows our dedicated staff to give individual attention to our students. Parish leadership recognized the importance of maintaining a faith-infused environment and strong academic tradition as demand for Catholic education grew in the Edina community. In response, Our Lady of Grace adopted new school leadership in the summer of 2022 and hired a Head of School, Middle School Principal, Lower School Principal and Preschool Director. This model provides an expert to oversee each specific developmental area for our students. Additionally, OLG has over 120 faculty and staff members across the parish and school to support the individual needs of each student. Unheard of in many Catholic Schools, Our Lady of Grace has an onsite Special Education Department, employs its own Learning Specialists, has a full-time School Counselor, has invested in the best evidence-based reading program (Groves Academy) as well as an in-house coach to oversee its implementation, and has two School Nurses. We are dedicated to maintaining a strong level of support as enrollment increases.

Preparing for High School in our New Middle School Building!



OLG is committed to the flourishing of its students. We believe that this is a critical time in their development, so eliminating the transition to a different school and the ability to have leadership experiences in a comfortable, known environment can lead to better academic performance and greater social/emotional development at this time in their lives. Because of this, OLG has invested in its Middle School by adding a new dedicated building for our 7th and 8th grade students, so they can be in an environment that best promotes their academic and personal flourishing.

Our Middle School students build their academic competency, self-advocacy, and confidence so that they are fully prepared for the challenges of high school. With a robust liberal arts curriculum including Language Arts (Reading and Writing), Math, Science, Social Studies, Religion, Spanish, Art, Music, Physical Education, Health, and Technology, OLG Middle School graduates are able to thrive and continue to develop into the people God has made them to be.



Accreditation

In the late spring of 2023, the Minnesota Nonpublic School Accrediting Association (MNSAA) awarded Our Lady of Grace Catholic School accreditation without reservation. This rigorous accreditation process follows a seven-year cycle, which culminated with a three-day visit by a seven-person accreditation team in late March. During the visit, the team looked for evidence of standards of quality schools by visiting classrooms, interviewing faculty and staff, meeting with members of the School Advisory Committee and the Parent School Organization, and reviewing School data. The team also reviewed parent feedback from the 2022 Comprehensive Parent Survey and looked to ensure that the feedback was used in the writing of our School Strategic Plan, which will guide the work of the School for the next six years. In their final report to the School, they noted the following strengths and opportunities for growth:



Strengths of OLG School:

1. Dedicated and highly educated staff
2. The number and quality of resources to support students (Learning Specialists, Literacy Coach, Campus Minister, School Counselor, Math Instructional Coach, Nursing Staff)
3. Highly functioning community support of the school

Opportunities for Growth:

1. Methods of organizing and documenting as the School grows
2. Care and keeping of large facility with many users
3. Desire to establish culture of virtue and consistent behavior expectations



Our Teachers are professionals dedicated to continual learning in order to provide the best possible education for our students!

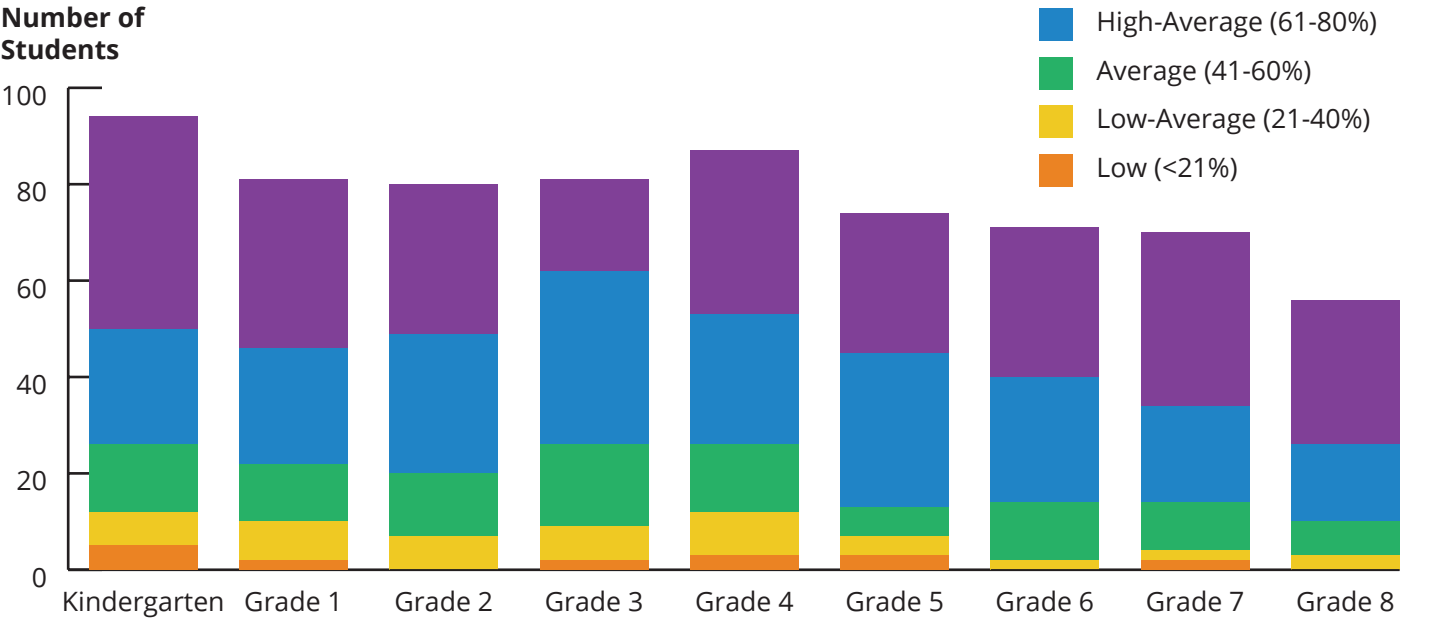
This past year, all of our Teachers and many of our School staff members attended a Catholic School Conference hosted by the Catholic School Center of Excellence. This event brought together over 2,000 Catholic School leaders, educators, and staff from schools throughout Minnesota for a day of large and small group sessions with dedicated time for prayer and fellowship.

Attendees enjoyed a day of inspiration, motivation and innovation, beginning with Mass led by Archbishop Bernard Hebda. Participants then joined breakout sessions focused on topics like addressing anxiety and depression in students, working with exceptional learners, excellence in middle school, multicultural inclusion, and math and reading teaching methods to facilitate excellence in our schools.



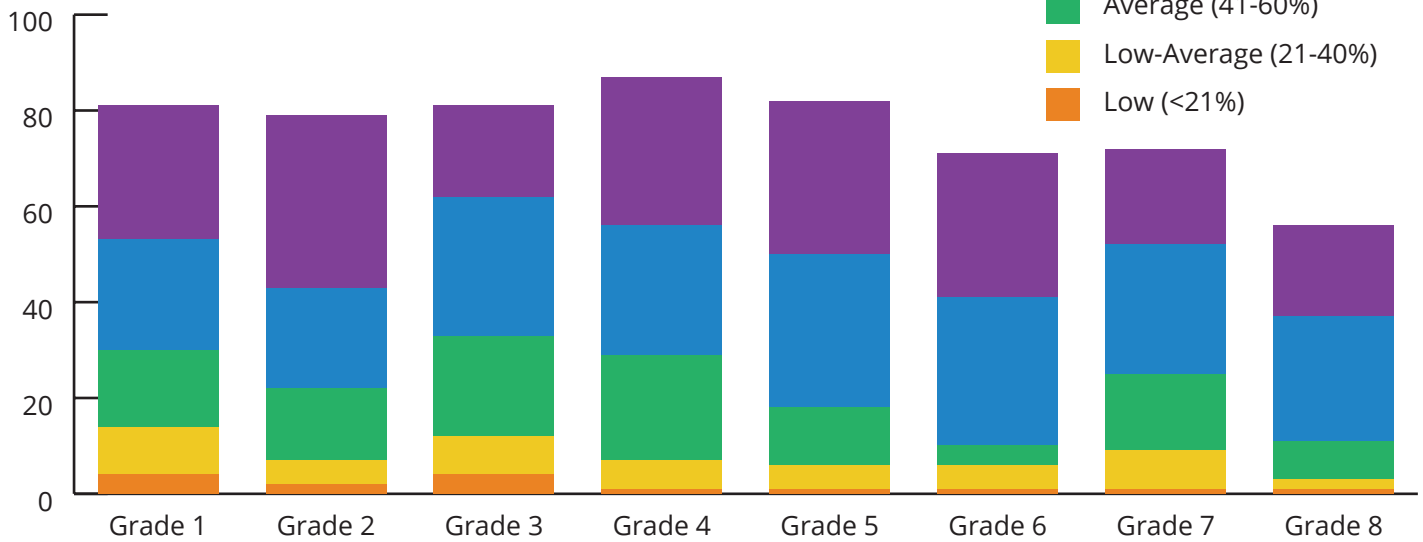
OLG students in grades K-8 take the NWEA MAP Growth test every fall and spring (kindergarten in spring only). MAP tests are student-paced and are individualized; each question a student receives is based on their answer to the previous one. We choose to use MAP tests because we receive a robust amount of data regarding individual student growth and performance as well as School performance compared to national averages. Teachers are able to see what concepts students have mastered and what they are ready to learn to better differentiate instruction in the classroom. Consistently, the vast majority of our students perform well above the national average in math, reading, and language usage. OLG is able to use MAP test data to continue to positively push students to reach their full academic potential.

MAP Test Overall Performance: Math



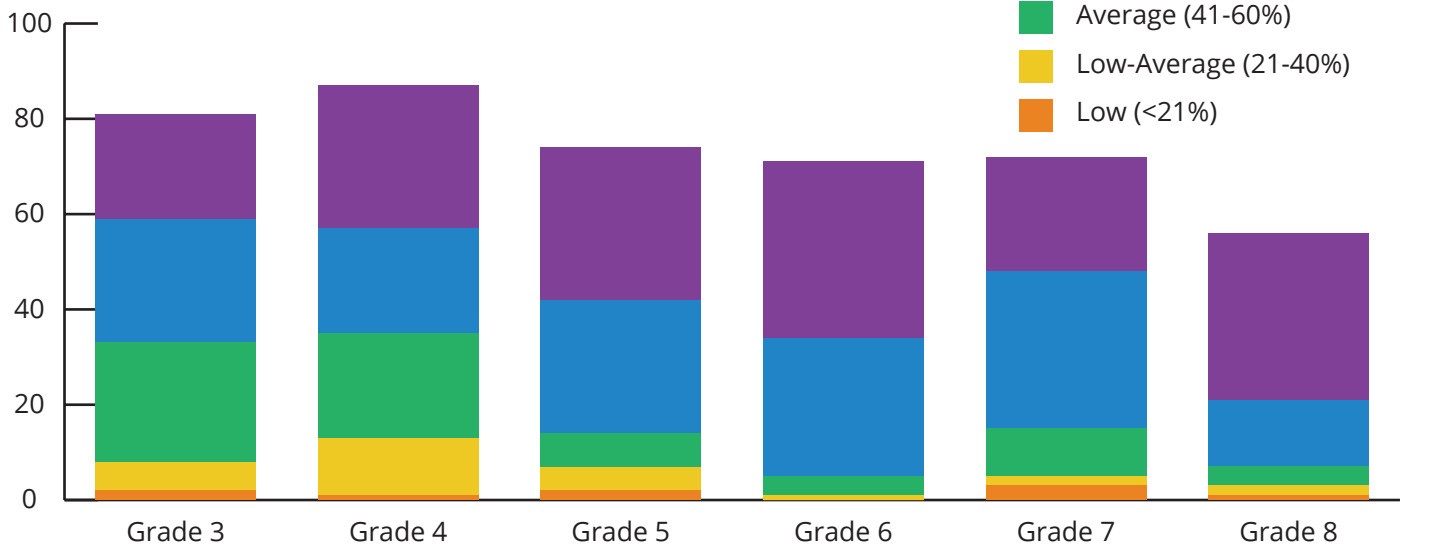
MAP Test Overall Performance: Reading

We are a "Believe and Read" School

As a "Believe and Read" school, we partner with Groves Academy to implement the Groves Literacy Framework, which is a reading curriculum based on the Science of Reading and is rooted in decades of literacy and brain research. We know that students learn best when instruction is direct, sequential, multimodal, and addresses individual strengths and challenges. The Groves approach ensures that our kindergarten through third grade students receive cutting-edge reading instruction ensuring academic success beyond third grade. Part of the Groves approach is collecting and using data to inform instructional decisions. We are so proud of our students, and their growth shows in the data!



A Community of Big Hearts

OLG students remained committed to praising God and serving others this year. Our Catholic School enjoyed weekly Masses, religion classes, faith formation experiences, and morning and afternoon prayer. OLG favorites from this school year included the Prayer Buddies tradition, which pairs students of different grades for liturgies and special events, and the 8th grade service project: Sweatshirts for Textbooks, benefiting students in Ghana. OLG hopes that our students will continue to serve God and others.



Liturgical Ministry:

- Students read at all 33 all-school Masses throughout the year.
- We are also very grateful for our students who served at Mass through music and gift bearing.

Altar Serving:

- 43 OLG students are altar servers.
- 32 OLG students served at all-school Masses (Wednesday all-school Mass, funerals during the school day, and Friday daily Masses).
- An additional 11 students served at weekend Masses.
- They served for 33 all-school Masses, 29 funerals, and 27 Friday daily Masses.

Livestream Team:

- All 72 of our 7th graders participated and learned the equipment.
- The students covered 34 Masses or special events and served 306 hours over the year.



The 2022-23 OLG Middle School Service Club is comprised of 74 students and four parent leaders. This year, they facilitated 49 events and worked over 368 volunteer hours. Some of their accomplishments included:

- 100 sets of Resurrection Eggs for school and Faith Formation students
- 300+ valentines for homeless kids at Sharing & Caring Hands
- 500+ ornaments for the Parish Giving Trees
- 1,300 goody bags for Valentine's Day and Palm Sunday

Leadership Opens Doors—Service is the Key

The **2022-2023 OLG Student Council** is comprised of 13 peer-elected student leaders. They are focused on Catholic Social Teachings, including: Call to Family, Community, and Participation; Rights and Responsibilities; Preferential Option for the Poor and Vulnerable; The Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers; and Solidarity.

They initiated several school-wide service projects throughout the year, including:

- Sole Searching Shoe Drive: Collected 538 pairs of shoes for Sharing & Caring Hands.
- Spring Sucker Fundraiser: Raised \$1,800 for our School and student community.

They also delivered enough Thanksgiving baskets to feed over 36 families and served as leaders, ushers, and hosts at OLG's annual Veterans Day Program.



Parent School Organization

This year, the PSO did a tremendous job developing volunteer and monetary resources for OLG School. Through 40 committees, the PSO supported our students, Teachers, administration, and parents through the areas of classroom support, community service, fellowship and families, fundraising, and School support. Some PSO highlights of the 2022-23 school year include:

- Santa's Secret Shop – supports our sister school, St. John Paul II Catholic School in northeast Minneapolis, as well as OLG.
- Marathon – supports OLG School funding for Teacher Assistants and Technology.
- Carnival – supports PSO events throughout the year.
- Read-a-thon – supports the Groves Reading Program for OLG students in grades K-3, which provides additional help to those students who are struggling with their reading.
